

# Community Integrated Paramedicine (CIP) Course

An innovative, hands-on approach to public health—a course for currently licensed emergency medical technicians (EMTs), advanced emergency medical technicians (AEMTs) and paramedics

## What is CIP?

Emergency medical services (EMS) personnel trained in CIP perform basic, nonemergent clinical tasks in people's homes aimed with the goal of:

- Preventing unnecessary emergency room (ER) visits, hospital admissions and readmissions
- Decreasing emergency room visits
- Extending healthcare access to those lacking insurance coverage, transportation or the ability to establish relationships with primary providers
- Providing better access to quality care for patients at home

## Class Details

### Training and Clinicals

- Two eight-hour lab training days requiring in-person attendance in Marquette.
- After completing class and lab requirements, students will have approximately five months to complete clinical rotations in the field.

### Objectives

- Conduct comprehensive assessments and physical examinations for patients in various settings.
- Offer appropriate care and interventions and facilitate coordination with the patient's healthcare team to establish a safe and effective care plan.

### Program Goal

- CIP addresses the healthcare disparities and inequities that reside within our community, especially among economically disadvantaged households.
