

Community Health Implementation Strategy

UP Health System — Portage Houghton County, Michigan



Overview

The Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) defines priorities for health improvement, creates a collaborative community environment to engage stakeholders, and an open and transparent process to listen and truly understand the health needs of the community served by UPHS – Portage (Houghton County, MI). This document is the UPHS – Portage Implementation Plan outlining how the hospital plans on addressing significant health needs in the community.

Community input was received into the 2019 implementation plan during a community meeting on October 28, 2019.

The CHNA is contained in a separate document.

UPHS – Portage's Board of Directors approved and adopted this Implementation Strategy on November 26, 2019.

Starting on DATE, 2019, this report is made widely available to the community via UPHS – Portage's website, www.portagehealth.org, and paper copies are available free of charge at UPHS – Portage.

Community Health Improvement/Implementation Plan 2019

To successfully make our community healthier, it is necessary to have a collaborative venture which brings together all of the care providers, citizens, government, schools, churches, not-for-profit organizations and business and industry around an effective plan of action. The community health needs assessment was completed previously and posted on UPHS – Portage's website.

Based on the results of the CHNA, UPHS – Portage has selected all the identified significant health needs to address.

- 1. Substance use disorder
- 2. Mental health
- 3. Healthy eating/Active living obesity
- 4. Access to care
- 5. Socioeconomics

UPHS-Portage plans to meet the **Substance Use Disorder** significant health need by:

- 1. Create a community coalition for mental health and substance use disorder to create collective impact.
 - Determine membership
 - Create purpose statement and charger
 - The Coalition can coordinate many of the action items associated with this community need
- 2. Support prevention and treatment programs within the community
 - Target youth and school-based substance use education and prevention programs (including traumabased programs)
 - Add substance use disorder to the UPHS-Portage Health Fair
 - Develop a referral process from UPHS-Portage Emergency Department to Great Lakes Recovery Center
 - Coordinate with Michigan Tech University to add substance use disorder education and resources to their health fair and orientation

Anticipated Impact:

- 1. Decrease substance use disorder in the county
- 2. Coordinate efforts throughout the county

The programs and resources the hospital plans to commit to address the health need:

- 1. Staff time to the community coalition
- 2. Human and monetary resources to schools, Great Lakes Recovery and Michigan Tech to develop programs and resources

UPHS – Portage will collaborate with:

- 1. All substance use disorder resources in the county
- 2. All schools in Houghton County
- 3. Great Lakes Recovery Center
- 4. Michigan Tech University (any other university or college wishing to participate)

UPHS-Portage plans to meet the Mental Health significant health need by:

- 1. Create a community coalition for mental health and substance use disorder to create collective impact.
 - Determine membership
 - Create purpose statement and charger
 - The Coalition can coordinate many of the action items associated with this community need
- 2. Hold a mental health community collaboration summit
- 3. Increase availability of behavioral health professionals
 - Work with local college and universities to increase training of mental health professionals (MSN, BSN, psychologists, MSW, Psychiatrists)
- 4. Develop infrastructure to support mental health education and services
 - Work with the Upper Great Lakes Family Health Center (FQHC) to acquire grant money to support mental health services
 - Add mental health to the UPHS-Portage Health Fair
 - Coordinate with Michigan Tech University to add mental health education and resources to their health fair and orientation

Anticipated Impact:

- 1. Increase mental health providers in the county
- 2. Coordinate efforts throughout the county
- 3. Decrease the stigma of mental health

The programs and resources the hospital plans to commit to address the health need:

- 1. Staff time to the community coalition
- 2. Human and monetary resources to Upper Great Lakes Family Health Center and Michigan Tech to develop programs and resources

UPHS – Portage will collaborate with:

- 1. All mental health resources in the county
- 2. Upper Great Lakes Family Health Center
- 3. Michigan Tech University (any other university or college wishing to participate)

UPHS-Portage plans to meet the **Healthy Eating/Active Living** significant health need by:

- 1. Conduct quarterly nutrition education events
 - Q1 Heart Health by the Numbers
 - Q2 Health & Safety Fair
 - Q3 Michigan Tech Health Fair
 - Q4 Maintain Don't Gain program
- 2. Conduct quarterly activity events
 - Q1 Great Bear Chase
 - Q2 Sisu Shuffle
 - Q3 Canal Run
 - Q4 Turkey Trot
- 3. Support and treat those with diabetes
 - Hold diabetes classes and support groups
 - Utilize the Pathway to Health Program

Anticipated Impact:

- 1. Improve nutrition knowledge
- 2. Increase activity

The programs and resources the hospital plans to commit to address the health need:

- 1. Staff time and monetary resources to the quarterly nutrition and activity events
- 2. Diabetes program

UPHS-Portage will collaborate with:

- 1. Pathway to Health Program
- 2. Michigan Tech University

UPHS-Portage plans to meet the Access to Care significant health need by:

- 1. Increase physicians in the community
 - Use incentives to recruit physicians to the community
 - Create a marketing campaign focused on staying and living in the U.P.
- 2. Create a screening program for kids and provide to all in schools

Anticipated Impact:

- 1. Increase physicians in the community
- 2. Provide pediatric screening to all kids in the county

The programs and resources the hospital plans to commit to address the health need:

- 1. Staff time and monetary resources to the recruitment of physicians
- 2. Staff time and monetary resources to the school screenings

UPHS-Portage will collaborate with:

- 1. Schools
- 2. Existing community physicians

UPHS-Portage plans to meet the **Socioeconomic** significant health need by:

- 1. Increase jobs in the county
 - As the second largest employer in the county, participate in KEDA and the Chamber of Commerce
 - Participate in job fairs at the colleges and universities in the U.P.

Anticipated Impact:

- 1. Increase jobs in the community
- 2. Increase awareness of local jobs

The programs and resources the hospital plans to commit to address the health need:

- 1. Staff time and monetary resources to economic development activities
- 2. Staff time and monetary resources to the job fairs

UPHS-Portage will collaborate with:

- 1. Colleges and Universities
- 2. Keweenaw Economic Development Agency (KEDA)
- 3. Chamber of Commerce
- 4. UPHS-Marquette

UPHS – Portage intends to address all the health needs identified in the CHNA in collaboration with other community organizations.
